
For your sake we are being put to death all day long. We are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.


Our Father, who art in heaven,

William "Bill" John Loomis, 70, of Mount Holly, North Carolina passed away on July 30, 2021 following a courageous fight with COVID-19.

Bill is survived by his wife Catherine (Cantrell) Loomis, and his children by his former wife, Christine (Wolf) Loomis: John Loomis and wife Erika of Eugene OR, and Renate Loomis of Seattle WA.
